Gateway employees at the Burnaby Casino are signing BCGEU membership cards because you're tired of unfair wages. You are joining the BCGEU because you want to be better paid for the key role you play to make Gateway a financial success.

Hourly rates that range from \$8.75 per hour to \$16.00 per hour are hard to live on in the Lower Mainland. Also, the current pay system means that long-time employees don't get any increases at all after they have worked for eight years.

Top Gateway executives each earn over \$300,000. They received large pay increases because the company is doing so well. Some of these pay increases are almost as big as your annual salary. The big question is, where is your raise?

Now that tip money is on the decline, it's important to win a fair, living wage. Your work is important. Gateway can afford to pay more.

It's the Union advantage that will help you win the higher wages that you deserve.

Gateway has been telling supervisors that they are managers and that they cannot join a union.

The BC Labour Relations Board has the final say on who is a manager and who can join a union, not your employer.
